JobNet Business Presentations

There have been some questions about the JobNet Business presentations in the last couple of days. Participation is not required; however ***we strongly encourage you to participate in both WisLine Web sessions.***

Regarding the two presentations at the Job Center Roundtable on Thursday, November 10th - these are demos of the new system, and an opportunity for people to ask questions. Becky Powell and Linda Williamson will be conducting the presentations. It will be the same presentation at both sessions.

Regarding the two WisLine Web sessions:

The one on Wednesday, November 9th is pre-implementation. By the time it rolls around you will have had the education URL to use for a couple of weeks to "play" in the new system, plus the training "videos" will be out. Linda Williamson and Becky Powell will be demoing some of the new things for people, to make sure they understand how things work, plus taking questions from the participants.

The Thursday, November 17th session is the fourth day after implementation. Linda and Becky will demo anything that we've had a lot of questions on, and take questions from the participants.

Both of the WisLine Webs are scheduled for two hours. If we run out of things to talk about, they will end early. They will definitely not be longer than 2 hours each.

The WisLine Web sessions are similar to the Equal Rights WisLine audio presentations from May of this year in that you use the speaker phone to hear the presentation. The WisLine Web has the additional feature of being able to see what we are demonstrating on your computer. That's why you need to be at a computer with a speaker phone nearby to participate.

If there will be several people at one location (same computer/speaker phone), only one person should register and put a list of all other attendees in the "Miscellaneous" box on the registration form. **Only 85 lines are available for each WisLine Web session. If possible, all participants at a location should participate using the one computer and speaker phone. This will allow all Job Centers to access the program.** One suggestion we received from a Job

Center is to set up a computer in a conference room for all staff who will be participating, in order for people to be able to hear and view the presentation without disturbing other staff. This may not be possible or even necessary at all locations.

Look for more information to come out next week about the education URL for JobNet Business, and about the training "videos".
