

JobNet Business Employer Login Page Updated

The JobNet Business employer login page (<http://jobnet.wisconsin.gov/business>) was updated late Wednesday afternoon. The changes are highlighted in yellow:

- At the suggestion of the DWD Service Desk, text was added at the top of the screen alerting employers to the new site and providing links to the PowerPoint presentation and step-by-step instructions for using JobNet Business.
- We clarified that employers call the DWS Call Center when they need assistance creating a DWD/Wisconsin Logon, logging in or other computer related problems.
